

ACADEMY COUNCIL MINUTES 07/11/17

Academy Councillors present: James Bryant, Samira Ali. Apologies: Eleonora Algerhedi

- Serena has decided not to put herself up for re-election - in January there will be three vacancies as two other members terms are up.
- No one put themselves forward to be a councillor last election round. What are the reasons for this? One thought is that the Academy Council is an advisory body and has no power in terms of making decisions. Parents/carers may not like this.
- Why do we not have a general governing body? Kevin explained how it works in the Trust. The current model was adopted so as to not to replicate structures in each of the Trust schools.
- Some parents were concerned that Trust directors are not aware of what happens in the school concerning parents - they would like more parental involvement. Kevin explained that the current model involves parents/carers putting their concerns to the Principal who feeds these back to the relevant committee.
- Question about Mark (former SENCO) – works one day now, not enough? Kevin explained how this is being managed with a trainee SENCO who is in place. Mark only paid for his time here. Time in other schools in recharged. Our school has more SEND provision for pupils than others in the area - we are lucky.
- Some parents do not want children taking part in the Christmas activities. We follow British values and offer a broad curriculum. Songs that we sing have no religious content whatsoever. The church is a community space which is also used by other groups e.g. Zumba
- Year 5 swimming coaches: Tower Hamlets have cut coaches, children have to walk back to school at end of swimming. There is nothing we can do about this - To provide coaches ourselves would be very expensive. Children have to swim 25m by the end of Y6, it is part of the curriculum, they need to learn to swim.
- Parents would like to learn more about the how our teachers teach the pupils in class so that they can also follow this at home. Kevin will set up curriculum information meetings which will have a focus on how we deliver each subject in school, and also what parents and carers can do to support their child in each area at home.
