This is a summary of how our school delivers music education to all our pupils across two areas – curriculum music and co-curricular provision including musical experiences and what changes we are planning in future years. This information is to help pupils and parents or carers understand what our school offers and who we work with to support our pupils' music education.

Part A: Curriculum music

This is about what we teach in lesson time and how much time is spent teaching music.

Lessons are delivered by specialist music teachers (Love2singUK) from Nursery through to year 6 including the special educational units (SEND). Children have one 45 minute lesson of music a week. Lessons take place in a dedicated music room with a great selection of resources. Children have the option to sign up for a range of music/performing arts clubs.

In addition to this, there are 20 minute singing assemblies for each year group weekly.

Students in each year group explore a new style of music every half term. Musicality and musical skills, i.e performing, listening and composing are developed incrementally over each year group. For example, students in year 1 develop their understanding of rhythmic notation. In Year 2, they use and develop this knowledge using rhythms from around the world.

We aim to promote pupils' confidence in and outside of the music classroom as well as their overall academia. The Music curriculum has been designed to help students to

understand different musical styles and cultures and recognise their cultural importance.

There are a range of performance opportunities for students across the school including two whole school performances per academic year (Christmas concert and summer concert) as well as music trips and workshops for example, Young Voices and a Year 6 production at the end of the academic year. EYFS perform a Christmas show in the Autumn term each year.

Our SEND classes follow a bespoke curriculum, catered to the needs and strengths of the children in the class. They explore their listening skills and use a range of instruments to help develop their knowledge of music and build their interpersonal skills.

In our music classrooms, you will see students learning through practical music and/or singing in every lesson using our wide range of music instruments, multimedia and resources.

Part B: Co-curricular music

This is about opportunities for pupils to sing and play music, outside of lesson time, including choirs and ensembles and how pupils can make progress in music beyond the core curriculum.

We are proud to offer peripatetic music lessons to KS2 students in Clarinet, Flute, Trumpet, Drums, Piano, Guitar and Singing. These lessons have excellent uptake with students learning on a 1:1 basis or in small groups. Each week, students who sign up for peripatetic music lessons have a 20 minute session with an instrumental specialist. In these lessons, students can work towards graded music exams and performance opportunities throughout the year.

As of September 2026, there will be charges incurred for instrumental lessons at the following rates per half term:

We offer the loan of instruments to all children who have peripatetic instrument lessons for no additional cost.

Students are also encouraged to join activities run by the local music hub THAMES.

Currently, we have a large KS2 choir who rehearse once a week during lunchtime and have many successful performances throughout the year. We also have a Ukulele club who rehearse each week after school learning vital musical and ensemble skills. Furthermore, we offer an after school drama club.
